WATER RESTRICTIONS:

The Town of Sinclair asks our residents:

- Do not water your lawns between 10am and 6 pm,
- Limit watering to 2-3 times a week,
- Conserve water to the best ability you can until further notice.
- Per Resolution No. 2022-03 – failure to comply with the above restrictions may result in criminal prosecution.
- Town of Sinclair ask residents to water big trees on right-of-ways as well, as they are the responsibility of the resident and that helps to keep them alive and healthy (per request from AC Tree company).

4. The Town of Sinclair assigned the opening hours for public parks as follows:
 - a. Washington Park, McCulloch Park, and Sinclair School Park shall be open to the public between the hours of 5:00am and 10:30pm (per Resolution No. 2022-08).
5. The Town of Sinclair created new parking spots as follows:
 - a. Lincoln Avenue, from the corner of Lincoln Avenue and North 5th Street and continuing west for 60 feet is designated as Loading and Unloading Only (per Resolution No 2022-06).
 - b. The west side of North 5th Street, from corner of Lincoln Avenue and continuing north for 44 feet as Handicapped parking (per Resolution No. 2022-07).
 - c. The west side of North 5th Street, beginning after the first 44 feet from the corner of Lincoln Avenue and continuing north for the next 120 feet as Fifteen Minutes Only parking (per Resolution No. 2022-07).
 - d. The designated parking zones will be indicated by appropriate signs.

BUILDING PERMITS: Everyone who is planning to build/install/add-on anything on their property is reminded to **appear in front of the Zoning Board BEFORE building anything**. Please check with the town clerk and/or maintenance department if you have any questions.

RECREATION DEPARTMENT & PARCO SINCLAIR HISTORICAL THEATRE: It's been a busy spring & summer for the Sinclair Recreation Department and looks to be a busy fall & winter season as well!

Sept. 19 – CCEDC Annual Meeting 6-10pm. The Carbon County Economic Development Committee will hold their Annual Stakeholders Meeting in the tea room and theatre. The Rec Hall will be closed early at 5pm this day for the set up for this event.

Sept. 21 – Senior BBQ. The “Senior Coffee Group” will have a summer ending “potluck” barbecue for any adults wishing to participate at 11am at the Washington Park Pavilion – in the case of inclement weather, this will be held at the Rec Hall.

Sept. 21 – Michael Martin Murphey Concert. Oct. 3,5,7,11 & 13 – Maker Mobile. The Maker Mobile is a trailer funded by the Wyoming Afterschool Alliance that is full of craft type materials to be used by youth around the county to do several different kinds of arts & crafts projects. It will be at the Rec Hall on Sept. 3, 5 & 7 and at the Sinclair Library on Sept. 11 & 13 for use by Sinclair youth to do different projects.

Oct. 5 – Senior/Adult Fall Field Trip. Any adults interested will take a trip out to the forest to see the sights of fall before heading into Encampment/Saratoga for lunch and then returning to Sinclair. Anybody interested in tagging along in their vehicle are welcome to do so.

FIRE DEPARTMENT: The week of 9-15 October 2022 is the Fire Prevention Week.
